## Realising Opportunities

Realising Opportunities (RO) is a national programme which for over 10 years has been giving students in Year 12 and the first year of college increased access to some of the country's leading research intensive universities.

RO students will be supported during their studies at school/college with increased information, advice and access to RO Partner universities. They will develop the skills they need to be successful at university and to make informed choices for their future. Since 2010, RO has supported over 11,000 students from over 500 schools and colleges. Data shows that 88% of the most recent RO students graduating obtained a First Class or Upper Second Class degree, substantially higher than the overall proportion of 79% of all graduating students.

### **RO** universities

All of the RO universities are leading research intensive universities (RIUs). This means they have:

- Leading academics and tutors, who are experts in their field.
- Vibrant learning environments where new discoveries are being made.
- Cutting edge facilities thanks to the investment associated with research.
- Top careers guidance and strong links with business.
- World-renowned reputations which are highly valued by employers.

## **RO** students

Students who are offered a place on the RO programme are the most able students but the least likely to attend a research intensive university. For example, they may: be the first in their family to attend university; come from an area where not many people go on to higher education; or be in receipt of free school meals or discretionary payments at school/college.

Students begin the programme in January of Year 12 and are supported until the end of Year 13. RO students benefit from a whole range of activities designed to develop their skills and better prepare them for university. Click here for Mohammed's story.

where students have the chance to meet others from across the country taking part in RO and representatives from all of the RO Partner universities



#### **Additional consideration**

when students make applications to RO Partner universities through UCAS.

## Students must complete three compulsory elements of the programme to complete RO:

- Attend at least two RO events or activities (these can be the Launch and the National Student Conference) to explore student life at RIUs.
- Pass the skills4uni online multiple choice quiz to develop study skills.
- Complete the RO Academic Skills Module (ASM) to increase study skills confidence.


