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Welcome

We hope you enjoy taking part in Realising Opportunities (RO). The programme is a chance for you to develop skills that will be beneficial during your current studies and at university.

For your commitment to the RO programme you will benefit by receiving additional consideration from the RO Partner universities when you apply to them through UCAS. You could also receive alternative RO offers which are typically two A level grades (or equivalent) lower than the standard offer.

However, it is important to note that recognition can vary at the RO Partner universities and there are some course exemptions. You should read each of the university statements on the following pages so you can understand what this means for you.

Because of the number of RO Partner universities, this guide contains a lot of information – but you don't need to feel overwhelmed. The RO Recognition Guide will remain on the RO website throughout your time on RO, so it's there whenever you want to look at it.

Getting recognition from RO Partner universities

You will benefit from using this guide at different points on your journey to university. We recommend checking this guide at the following times:

- **When you are researching the courses you might like to apply to**, check the Partner university pages to see what recognition you could receive. For some courses it is not possible to gain an alternative RO offer. Where relevant these are referred to in the 'Course exemptions' section of each Partner university recognition statement within this guide.
- **View this Recognition Guide alongside the entry requirements for the year of entry**. View this guide alongside the entry requirements for the year of entry. If you are applying to 2024 entry to university, refer to the 2024 entry requirements. These may be published between spring 2023 and September 2023. Please note that entry requirements may change between spring and September so do make sure you check before submitting an application.
- **You could use this guide to discuss your university choices** with your parents/carers or teachers at school/college, so they understand the options available to you and are able to support you with this information in mind.
- **When applying to RO Partner universities through the UCAS Hub** you should identify yourself as an RO student. Guidance on how to do this will be emailed to you in summer 2023. Please look out for this communication and if you have any questions when you come to submit your application then please contact info@realisingopportunities.ac.uk
- **When a RO Partner university makes you an offer**, check this guide alongside details of the standard offer to see if you have received the offer you expected.
- **If you have a query about a course or offer**, you can refer to the 'For further information' section of each RO Partner university's recognition statement.

You are not limited to applying to one RO Partner university or course. You can apply to, and have the potential to receive offers from, the maximum number of choices on your UCAS application (which is usually five).

RO offers explained

Dual offers

When alternative RO offers are given, this will usually be in the form of a dual offer which will include the standard offer and the alternative RO offer. Alternative RO offers are dependent upon the successful completion of the RO programme. Alternative RO offers are typically 2 A level grades lower than the standard offer. For example, this means a standard offer of AAB could be reduced by 2 grades to ABC or BBB. If the example standard offer of AAB was reduced by one grade, this could be ABB.

Other admissions criteria

Usually alternative RO offers are dependent on you meeting all other admissions criteria such as GCSE requirements, predicted grades, subject specific requirements, work experience, interview performance or portfolio submission. You should check the relevant university's online prospectus to understand these course requirements for any university and/or course you may be interested in.



Passing the RO programme

If you receive an alternative RO offer from a RO Partner university it will be dependent on your successful completion of the RO programme. In order to pass the RO programme you must:

- Attend at least 2 events or activities run by a RO Partner university (this usually is the Launch event and National Student Conference).
- Complete and pass the skills4uni challenge and quiz.
- Complete the Academic Skills Module.

The RO Central Team will communicate your successful completion of the RO programme to the RO Partner universities. Make sure you check the conditions of any offers you receive carefully. FAQs

What if I haven't passed RO yet?

As long as you record your participation in RO on your UCAS form (see page 4 of this guide), the RO Partner universities will know that you are a RO student. If, when you apply, you still have aspects of the programme to complete, any alternative offers you are made will be subject to your successful completion of the programme. The RO Central Team update the RO Partner universities on your RO progress before results day. Any universities you are holding offers with will have access to your grades. This means they will be able to confirm whether you have passed the programme and met the terms of your alternative RO offer.

What if I want to take a gap year?

You may be looking to go to university straight after completing your post 16-studies or you may be interested in taking time out before starting university. RO students that successfully complete the RO programme can access the associated recognition for up to two years after leaving post-16 studies. An example is if you left post-16 studies in 2024, you would be eligible for RO recognition for 2025 and 2026 entry to university. 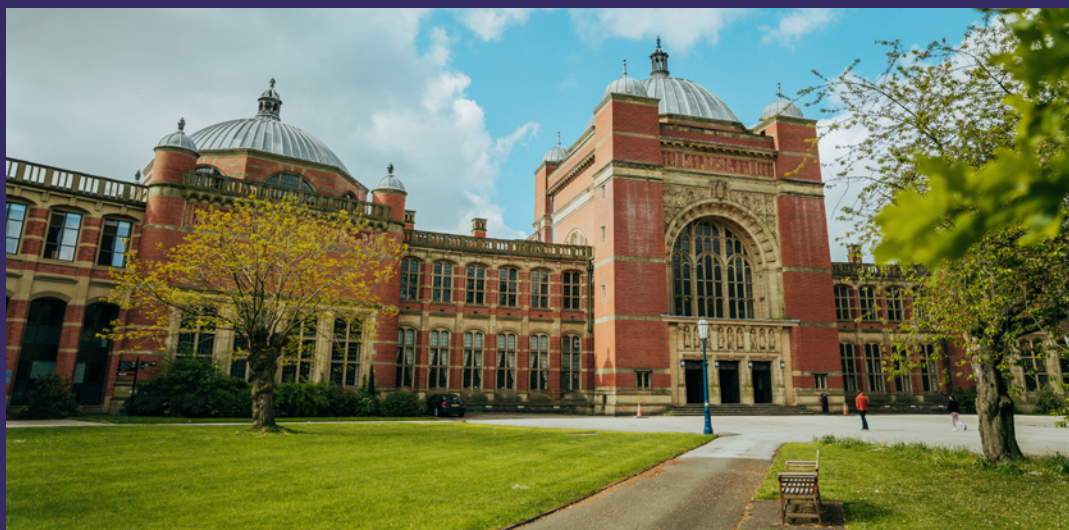
Clearing

Alternative RO offers are not applicable in Clearing but Clearing offers can vary from standard offers and might be lower than a standard offer. Do remember however that not all courses will be available in Clearing.

Why do Partner universities give alternative offers?

RO Partner universities are committed to widening access to university, and Realising Opportunities supports RO Partner universities to reach more young people. In completing the compulsory elements of the RO programme, students gain skills, experience and knowledge to help them succeed at university and beyond. RO Partner universities recognise this effort and commitment with their alternative RO offers.





Additional consideration

Your application as an RO student will receive additional consideration when you apply to the University of Birmingham through UCAS. This is dependent on you meeting all other admissions criteria which can include subject-specific requirements such as interview performance, aptitude tests and GCSE grades.

Alternative offers

If you are given an offer then you will receive a dual offer recognising your successful completion of RO. You will receive a standard offer as well as an alternative RO offer of:

- Typically 2 A level grades lower or
- Up to 2 International Baccalaureate points in Higher Level subjects or
- 1 full BTEC National Diploma grade or
- A reduced number of distinctions required for an Access to HE course

Medicine and Dentistry

The standard offer for Medicine is A*AA and Dentistry is AAA. The typical alternative RO offer is ABB (including Chemistry and Biology, minimum predicted grades BBB) plus successful completion of RO. Students need to have a minimum of seven GCSEs at grade 4 or above. The following subjects must all be at grade 5 minimum and any two must

be at grade 7 minimum: English Language, English Literature, Maths, Chemistry and Biology (or double Science). Students will also be required to sit the UCAT.

Course exemptions

Alternative RO offers will be made for all degree courses at the University of Birmingham where an offer is made. Alternative offers will not be made on Foundation Year programmes.

Additional consideration

Your application as an RO student will receive additional consideration when you apply to the University of Exeter through UCAS. This is dependent on you meeting all other admissions criteria.

Alternative offers

Realising Opportunities participants who apply to study at the University of Exeter will be guaranteed to receive an offer for their course of choice, subject to any interviews and/or subject specific entry requirements*.

If you are given an offer then it will be an alternative RO offer recognising your successful completion of the programme. The alternative offer will be as follows:

- Typically 2 A level grades lower or
- Up to 2 International Baccalaureate points in Higher Level subjects or
- 1 full BTEC National Diploma grade or
- A reduced number of distinctions required for an Access to HE course.

Specific entry requirements for your year of entry will be published on the University of Exeter website in the summer before you apply, to include any additional consideration subsequently available to RO participants.

* The offer guarantee is subject to applicants fulfilling any subject-specific and GCSE

entry requirements. For programmes where interviews are required, applicants will be guaranteed an invitation to interview, but offers will be dependent on performance at interviews. For BMBS Medicine, applicants will also be required to have taken the required UCAT / GAMSAT test. Please note that UCAT / GAMSAT scores will not form part of the selection process prior to interview, but they may be taken into account in reaching final decisions on any offer post-interview.

Course exemptions

There are no course exemptions. Alternative offers will be made for all degree courses at the University of Exeter where an offer is made.

Other information

Alternative RO offers from the University of Exeter will include a higher set of grades which if achieved will mean applicants who have successfully completed RO will receive an Attainment Award of £1500 for their first year of study.

Additional consideration

Your application as an RO student will receive additional consideration when you apply to Lancaster University through UCAS. This is dependent on you meeting all other admissions criteria.

Alternative offers

If you are given an offer from Lancaster University it will be a dual offer recognising your successful completion of RO. You will receive a standard offer as well as an alternative RO offer of:

- Typically 3 A level grades or equivalent lower than the standard offer
- Up to 2 full BTEC National Extended Diploma grades

We may specify minimum grades in particular subjects depending on the course entry requirements.

Course exemptions

Alternative offers will not be made for the following courses:

A104 Medicine with a Gateway Year MBChB
N2R4 International Business Management (Spain)

A100 Medicine & Surgery

Although Medicine & Surgery (A100) is exempt from the Realising Opportunities programme, there is a

medicine specific contextual offer scheme. Realising Opportunities students interested in applying to Medicine and Surgery are encouraged to explore the contextual lowered offer scheme. The alternative Medicine & Surgery contextual offer is subject to completing the supplementary information form and supplying appropriate documentary evidence that you meet Lancaster Medical School's specific eligibility criteria. Other information

Some courses require an additional selection process such as an interview, a submission of a portfolio, or aptitude test. For those courses RO applicants will still be required to take part in this before any offer is made.

For certain courses, the offer will be subject to the RO student studying specific subjects and achieving specific grades in those subjects.

Additional consideration

Your application as an RO student will receive additional consideration when you apply to the University of Leeds through UCAS. This is dependent on you meeting all other admissions criteria.

Alternative offers

If you are given an offer then you will receive a dual offer recognising your successful completion of RO. You will receive a standard offer as well as an alternative RO offer of:

- Typically 2 A level grades lower than the standard offer or
- Up to 1 full BTEC National Diploma grade below the standard offer or
- Where possible for other qualifications, the UCAS tariff point equivalent of the above reductions below the standard offer.

Course exemptions

Alternative offers will not be made for courses including a foundation year. Alternative RO offers will be made for undergraduate degree programmes at the University of Leeds where a standard offer is made.

Other information

RO students who study at the University of Leeds are eligible for additional on-course support through The Plus Programme. This support includes academic skills development, social activities and careers guidance.

Additional consideration

Your application as an RO student will receive additional consideration when you apply to the University of Leicester through UCAS. This is dependent on you meeting all other subject specific admissions criteria, which may include aptitude tests and interviews.

Alternative offers

If you are given an offer then you will receive a dual offer recognising your successful completion of RO. You will receive a standard offer as well as an alternative RO offer of:

- Typically 2 A level grades lower than our standard offer or
- Up to 2 International Baccalaureate points below our standard offer or
- 1 full BTEC National Diploma grade below our standard offer or
- A reduced number of distinctions required for an Access to HE course.

Other recognition

RO students applying to study Medicine (A100) at Leicester Medical School must meet the standard GCSE minimum requirements for medicine.

To be invited directly to interview (without the combined score of your academic achievement and the UCAT being considered), RO students must be predicted or have achieved at least AAA at first sitting in our

required subjects (to include either Biology or Chemistry, and one from Biology, Chemistry, Maths, Psychology or Physics), have a minimum of a 6/B in GCSE English language, Maths and two Sciences (at first sitting); and have a UCAT score in the top 7 deciles with a SJT band 1-3.

The standard offer for medicine is A*AA and the alternative offer for those with successful completion of RO is AAA (including Biology or Chemistry, plus one other science from Biology, Chemistry, Maths, Physics or Psychology). The alternative RO offer for IB is 34 points overall with 6,6,6, at higher level in the subjects above. If you are applying with completed A-levels, the alternative offer only applies for those with a single gap year.

Course exemptions

Direct invites to interviews and alternative RO offers will not be made for our A199 Medicine with a Foundation Year course, nor any of our STEM 'with Foundation Year' programmes (F991/G991/H991/F992/F993/G992/F994/F995).

Additional consideration

Your application as an RO student will receive additional consideration when you apply to the University of Liverpool through UCAS. This is dependent on you meeting all other admissions criteria, for example, interview performance, subject-specific requirements and GCSE grades.

Alternative offers

If you are given an offer then you will receive a dual offer recognising your successful completion of RO. You will receive a standard offer as well as an alternative RO offer of:

- Typically 2 A level grades lower than the standard offer or
- For students taking the International Baccalaureate (IB) – up to 2 IB points. Students must also successfully pass the IB Diploma as a whole.
- For students taking a Pearson BTEC Level 3 National Extended Diploma - up to 1 grade. For example, where the standard offer is DDD the student must achieve DDM overall*

*Note: not all programmes accept applications from candidates offering BTEC qualifications.

Other recognition

RO students applying to Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Science at the University of Liverpool may not be required to meet the strict GCSE entry requirements outlined in the University's guidelines. Applicants should check the GCSE requirements with the relevant department.

Course exemptions

There are no course exemptions. Alternative RO offers will be made for all degree courses at the University of Liverpool.

Additional consideration

Your application as an RO student will receive additional consideration when you apply to Loughborough University through UCAS.

Alternative offers

If you are successful in being made an offer for your chosen course, then you will receive a standard offer as well as an alternative RO offer (subject to you successfully completing RO) of:

- Typically 2 A level grades lower than the standard offer or
- Up to 2 International Baccalaureate points lower in Higher Level subjects or
- 1 full BTEC National diploma grade lower.

Please note that specific grades in certain subjects will still be required for some courses.

Course exemptions

Courses which include a Foundation Year are not in a position to make alternative offers.

Other information

All offers and alternative offers are subject to applicants fulfilling any subject specific entry requirements at A level or equivalent and minimum GCSE or equivalent requirements. For some courses, offers are subject to a successful interview and/or review of a portfolio.

If you are given an offer then you will receive a dual offer recognising your successful completion of RO. You will receive a standard offer as well as an alternative RO offer of:

- Typically 2 A level grades (or equivalent) lower than the standard offer for all courses at Newcastle University.

Course exemptions

There are no course exemptions. Alternative RO offers will be made for all degree programmes at Newcastle University where an offer is made.

Other information

For courses that require an additional selection process, such as an interview or submission of a portfolio, RO applicants will still be required to take part in this before any offer is made.

Additional consideration

Your application as an RO student will receive additional consideration when you apply to the University of Nottingham through UCAS. This is dependent on you meeting all other admissions criteria.

Alternative offers

If you are given an offer then you will receive a dual offer recognising your successful completion of RO. You will receive a standard offer as well as an alternative RO offer which is typically 2 A level grades lower than the standard offer.

For undergraduate courses with entry requirements of BBB, the lowest enhanced contextual offer the University of Nottingham would make is BBC.

Course exemptions

Alternative offers will not be made for Medicine and foundation courses. A maximum of one grade reduction will be made for Veterinary Medicine.

Other information

For 2023 entry, the University of Nottingham will provide a contextual offer of 2 A level grades for Realising Opportunities students. If our standard offer includes a specific subject grade, this will generally remain. For example, if the standard offer is AAA with an A in Maths, the contextual offer would be ABB with an A in Maths.

Some courses include an interview or test as part of the entry requirements. You will need to pass this before we can make you an alternative offer.

Queen Mary University of London



Additional consideration

Your application as an RO student will receive additional consideration when you apply to Queen Mary University of London through UCAS. This is dependent on you meeting all other admissions criteria.

Alternative offers

If you are given an offer then you will receive a dual offer recognising your successful completion of RO. You will receive a standard offer as well as an alternative RO offer of:

- Typically 2 A level grades lower than the standard offer or
- Up to 2 International Baccalaureate points in Higher Level subjects

We may specify minimum grades in particular A level or Higher Level subjects depending on the course entry requirements.

Combinations of BTEC and A Level qualifications may not be eligible for the alternative offer, please contact realisingopportunities@qmul.ac.uk before you apply to discuss your qualifications.

Course exemptions

BSc Oral Health (A910) is not eligible for an alternative offer.

Degrees with Integrated Foundation Years and standalone foundation programmes are not eligible for an alternative offer.

Law (M100) and joint programmes involving Law. The offer for RO students applying for our single honours and joint honours programmes involving Law will be AAA. Our standard offer for single honours Law (M100) is A*AA.

Medicine (A100) and Dentistry (A200)

All RO students who meet the minimum GCSE entry requirements, are predicted to achieve AAA in relevant A level subjects and attain a minimum 3rd decile score in the UCAT will automatically be selected for interview. If offered a place, RO students will receive an AAA offer, rather than the standard A*AA offer. There are a smaller number of ring-fenced places (Medicine only) for which RO students who meet minimum GCSE entry requirements, are predicted to achieve AAB and attain a minimum 4th decile score in the UCAT will also be invited for interview. If offered one of these ring-fenced places, RO students will receive an AAB offer, rather than the standard A*AA offer.

Additional consideration

Your application as an RO student will receive additional consideration when you apply to the University of Sheffield through UCAS. This is dependent on you meeting all other admissions criteria.

Alternative offers

If you are given an offer then you will receive a dual offer recognising your successful completion of RO. You will receive a standard offer as well as an alternative RO offer of:

- Typically 2 A level grades lower or
- Up to 2 International Baccalaureate Diploma points (*overall Diploma score and not individual Standard or Higher Level Certificate scores*)
- Up to 1 full BTEC National Diploma grade below the standard requirements for your course.

Course exemptions

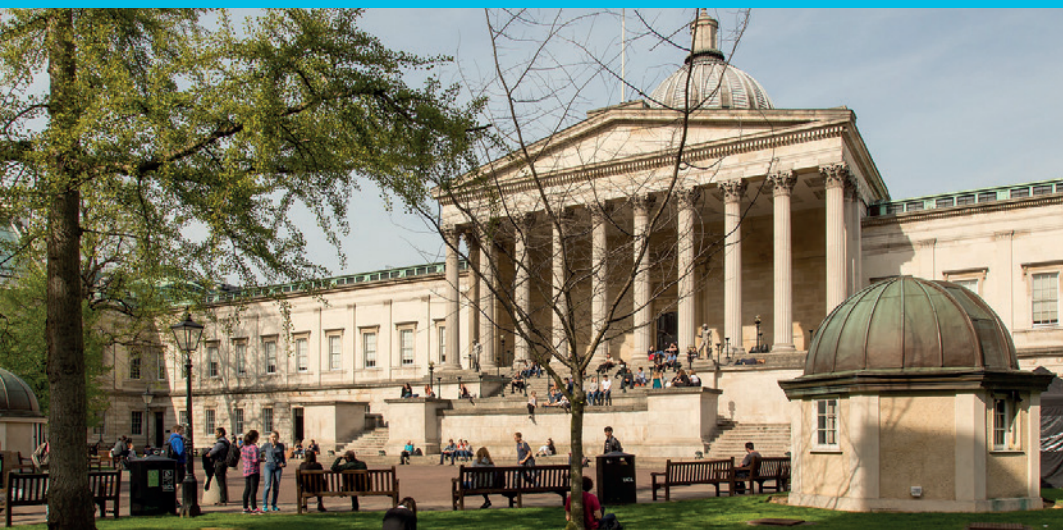
Alternative offers will not be made for Science and Engineering courses with a Foundation Year or for any of our Foundation Years offered by the Department for Lifelong Learning.

Other information

For courses that require an additional selection process, such as an interview, pre-entry test or submission of a portfolio, RO applicants will still be required to take part in this before any offer is made.

Additional consideration

Your application as an RO student will receive additional consideration when you apply to UCL through UCAS. This is dependent on you meeting all other admissions criteria.

Alternative offers

If you are given an offer then you will receive a dual offer recognising your successful completion of RO. You will receive a standard offer as well as an alternative RO offer of:

- Typically 2 A level grades lower than the standard offer.

Course exemptions

There are no course exemptions. Alternative RO offers will be made for all degree courses at UCL where an offer is made.

Other information

For programmes that require an additional selection process, such as an interview or submission of a portfolio, RO applicants will still be required to take part in this before any offer is made.

Additional consideration

Your application as an RO student will receive additional consideration when you apply to the University of Warwick through UCAS. This is dependent on you meeting all other admissions criteria.

Alternative offers

If you are given an offer then you will usually receive a dual offer recognising your successful completion of RO. You will receive a standard offer as well as an alternative RO offer of:

- Typically 2 A level grades lower than the standard offer or
- Up to 4 International Baccalaureate points lower than the standard offer for entry to that course.

Course exemptions

There are no course exemptions. Alternative RO offers will be made for all degree courses at the University of Warwick where an offer is made.

Other information

Whilst it is important that you meet the admissions criteria for your chosen course

(these are available via the **University's prospectus**), Warwick pays particular attention to an applicant's **personal statement** in the admissions process. It is therefore advisable that your statement draws upon your experience on the RO programme, what you have learnt on the programme and how this applies to your chosen course.

For courses that require an additional selection process, such as an interview or submission of a portfolio, RO applicants will still be required to take part in this before any offer is made.

By completing the Realising Opportunities programme, you will automatically be considered for our **Warwick Scholars Undergraduate Programme** when coming to study at Warwick.

University of York/John Houlihan

Additional consideration

Your application as an RO student will receive additional consideration when you apply to the University of York through UCAS. This is dependent on you meeting all other admissions criteria.

Alternative offers

If you are given an offer then you will receive a dual offer recognising your successful completion of RO. You will receive a standard offer as well as an alternative RO offer of:

- Typically up to 3 A level grades lower or
- Up to 2 International Baccalaureate points in Higher Level subjects or
- 1 full BTEC National Extended Diploma grade or
- A reduced number of distinctions required for an Access to HE course.

Course exemptions

Alternative offers will not be made for the A101 Medicine with a Gateway Year at Hull York Medical School. Furthermore, the A100 Medicine course at Hull York Medical School has an alternative offer of up to two A Level grades lower.

Other information

For courses that require an additional selection process, such as an interview or submission of a portfolio, RO applicants will still be required to take part in this before any offer is made.
