Programme

What does RO Closure mean for me as a Cohort 16 student?

The RO programme ended for you in July 2026 as planned.

- If you have passed the RO programme:
 - You will still receive any RO [alternative offers/additional consideration](#) which you are eligible for, if you are planning to start university in 2026.
- If you have not passed the RO programme:
 - The deadlines to complete the RO programme have now passed, however you may still be eligible for additional consideration from the RO Partner universities. Please [contact them directly](#) to check.
 - If you are planning to re-sit Year 13/second year of college **and** you have not completed RO, please let us know by **1 September 2026** so we can advise you on your options.
- If you're taking a gap year and would like to receive some additional support, you can sign up to our [Year Out Mailing list](#). You'll receive quarterly emails from the RO Central Team covering topics such as student finance, accommodation, and more!

It's important to remember that your hard work and achievements on the RO programme are still highly valued by universities and will continue to be recognised.

I am in Cohort 16 and plan to re-sit Year 13/second year of college, can I still complete the RO programme?

If you are planning to re-sit Year 13/second year of college and you have not completed RO, please let us know by **1 September 2026** so we can support you to pass the programme.

How do I know if I have passed the RO programme?

You can check your progress on the RO programme by logging into the RO Student Hub and viewing the Progress Checker. This tells you what you have left to complete on the RO programme. The [Student User Guide](#) explains how to access the Progress Checker in more detail.

We recommend that you access the RO Student Hub **before 23 July 2027**.

How do I find out what cohort I am in?

You are in Cohort 16.

You can also view your cohort by logging into the [RO Student hub](#) where it is displayed on your [RO profile](#).

I'm planning to apply to university for 2027 entry; can I still access the RO alternative (lower) offers?

If you have passed the programme, you will still receive any RO [alternative offers/additional consideration](#) which you are eligible for if you are planning to apply to university by 13 January 2027 for 2027 entry or deferred 2028 entry.

How long can I access RO additional consideration and alternative (lower offers)?

Students who pass the RO programme can access the RO alternative offer for two years after leaving post-16 studies (three years in total).

If you are planning to apply for 2028 entry, we will be in touch with further information.

You won't be eligible to receive the RO alternative offer for 2029 entry to university, as your last year of RO recognition was 2028 entry (two years after leaving post-16 studies). [This is explained on page 8 of your Benefits Guide](#).

Where can I find information about the RO alternative offers and additional consideration?

You can find this information in your [Benefits Guide](#). Each page includes information about offers, requirements and courses which are exempt from the RO alternative offer.

Can I still complete the RO programme if I haven't already?

The RO programme ended for you in July 2026, which means you won't be able to pass the programme at this stage. You may still be eligible for additional consideration when applying to the RO Partner universities, but this isn't guaranteed. Please [email the universities](#) directly to check.

However, if you are planning to re-sit Year 13/second year of college and you have not completed RO, please let us know by **1 September 2026** so we can support you to pass the programme.

Will I still be able to access blogs and resources on the RO website after July 2027?

The RO Website will close at the end of July 2027, which means you won't be able to access any blogs or resources that are hosted on the website. It's a good idea to download any resources to your laptop/computer and take screenshots/copy and paste any blogs that you have found useful and want to refer to.

The RO Central team will collate and share other useful resources and websites that cover topics such as university applications, student life, student finance, and other information to support you throughout the university application process. This will be sent to the email address on your RO hub.

RO Closure

Why is RO closing?

The core aim of the RO programme was to increase the number of students who were most able but least likely to enter research intensive universities. To date, the programme has been highly successful in its core aim, with over 85% of RO students progressing to higher education. Having succeeded in meeting the core aim, the Partnership feel now is the right time to bring the programme to a close.

The decision to close RO has not been taken lightly, however the RO Partner universities remain committed to supporting underrepresented students in accessing higher education. How many students has RO supported?

RO has supported 17 cohorts of students since 2009, which is more than 16,400 students!
