What is the Realising Opportunities (RO) National Student Conference (NSC)?

The NSC is one highlight of the RO programme. At the virtual NSC you will:



Meet other students taking part in RO via the secure online events platform. You can also chat to student ambassadors from the RO Partner universities.



Learn more about the kinds of research happening at the RO Partner universities by hearing from the researchers themselves!



Access all the RO Partner universities at the University Exhibition where you can get information about the universities and the courses they offer (more information on the exhibition is on page 4).



Receive information about careers from well-known employer organisations at the Career Exhibition.



Get the low down on student life at RIUs, student finance, or applying to uni by taking part in your choice of live sessions.

These experiences will be useful on the RO programme and beyond.

Throughout the day the Help Desk is open to answer any queries about the NSC, or the RO programme.

From **10am to 1pm** and **2-3pm** student ambassadors from the RO Partner universities will be available in the Social Space to chat, answer questions on student life or play some ice breaker games if you need energising.

Your invite

The RO Central Team will communicate with you via email ahead of the event about how to join the Virtual NSC.



Attendance requirements

The NSC is a compulsory element of the RO programme because it provides lots of useful information for your time on RO and beyond. If you cannot attend the virtual event, you should let the RO Central Team know in advance.

In order to be considered as having fully attended the Virtual NSC, students need to at least:

- Attend at least one My Research session (there are 4 to choose from)
- And spend at least 15 minutes across any exhibition booths
- And attend one of the afternoon sessions (there are 3 to choose from).

The online platform records student attendance at the different sessions to support the recording of overall NSC attendance.



Breakdown of sessions

My Research sessions

Researchers from the RO Partner universities will talk to you about their research projects and work. On the day choose the research stream session which interests you most:

- 1a. Life and Health Sciences
- 1b. Creative Arts and Humanities
- 2a. Engineering and Physical Sciences
- 2b. Social Sciences

The research subject areas covered within the My Research sessions might be unfamiliar to you - but the researchers know this and tailor the sessions with this in mind. **Read more about choosing a session here.**

Afternoon sessions

Hear from staff across the RO Partner universities on topics requested by RO students!

Choose the live session which is most helpful for you:

- 3a. Student life at RIUs - think societies, sports, hobbies and more!
- 3b. Student finance - what is it, who needs it and how do you apply?
- 3c. Applying to university – choosing a university, course and making an application via UCAS.

You will be able to contribute to the live sessions through text-based chat - you won't be expected to be on camera.

The exhibitions

All RO Partner universities will have a virtual booth at the University Exhibition, and staff will be on hand to answer your queries. You can also browse useful information like online prospectuses. The exhibition is a great opportunity to explore what the RO Partner universities have to offer, and we recommend thinking of some questions to ask in advance.

You may have the opportunity in the future to attend UCAS fairs or other higher education exhibitions, so the NSC is a good opportunity to experience a fair and practise asking questions.

Employer organisations will be at the Career Exhibition to provide information about different careers and answer your questions.

You will ask questions in the exhibition through text-based live chat - you won't be on camera.

Questions for the University Exhibition

What would you like to know more about?

Ask questions to find the answers!

Relevant questions could be:

- What kind of courses do you offer?
- How will RO help my application?
- What are your entry requirements?

Don't worry, if you still have questions after the exhibition, there are lots of ways to find the answers.

You will be able to see the answers to questions other students are asking, so take a look at all the helpful information being provided.

Tips for the exhibitions

- Remember no question is too small.
- Why not visit the booth for the university you know least about? The University Exhibition is a chance to explore the RO Partner universities!
- Browsing the Career Exhibition stands will help you to think about your career ambitions. Thinking about your career will help you to make informed choices about your future.
